Approaches to Teaching	Explicitly ask students to discuss and reflect on the value and limitations of a diverse range of resources used through their inquiries.	Collaborate with the librarian and technology specialists to build research skills and to learn how to identify reliable and unbiased sources of information.	Recognize cultural differences in communication, and encourage multilingual communication.	Provide opportunities for students to reflect on and gain a better understanding of their own multiple cultural and personal identities.	Provide opportunities for students to monitor and manage their learning to make progress, holding high expectations for all students.
Approaches to Learning (Primary)	Use models and simulations to explore complex systems and issues, and recognize the interconnectedness of global issues.	Differentiate reliable/unreliable and biased/unbiased sources.	Read a variety of sources of diverse materials for information and for pleasure.	Practise empathy and care for all others.
